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Mark T. Reding, MD, is Director of the Center for Bleeding and Clotting Disorders and Professor of Medicine in the Division of Hematology, Oncology and Transplantation at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. He earned his medical degree and completed both internal medicine residency and hematology/oncology fellowship training at the University of Minnesota, where he has subsequently remained as a faculty member since 1999.

Dr. Reding is a multi-year recipient of the Division's Outstanding Clinical Mentor Award and the Department of Medicine's Clinical Excellence Award. In 2022 he received the University of Minnesota Medical Center Clinical Research and Innovation Award, and in 2024 he was recognized as Physician of the Year by the National Bleeding Disorders Foundation.

In addition to clinical and teaching duties, Dr. Reding has laboratory research experience investigating the mechanisms of the immune response to factor VIII and has served as principal investigator of many clinical trials in hemophilia.
